Jeanne Hoffman is a 99 yr old female in clinic with son, Louis, for continued wound care of Left Lower Extremity (LLE) venous stasis ulcers. Last visit was on June 5, 2024.

Pt and son continue to describe difficulty managing wound care at their residence due to limitations of space for storing the appropriate equipment for home treatments, ensuring clean spaces for dressing changes, and delayed repairs leaving open ceilings and unresolved moisture abatement increasing the risk of airborne pathogens. Also described are safety concerns in the shower where appropriate fall prevention interventions cannot be implemented and the pt has experienced at least one fall needing an ER visit. Their living situation is such that one of them reportedly sleeps on the couch.

Pictures of their residence show lifelong accumulated belongings which need more space than a one bedroom apartment can provide. These belongings are important for the quality of life for the patient and her son. Per the son, lack of space also impacts the quality of food for the both of them.

Today's wound care is described below. A provider appt was scheduled for evaluation of the wounds after one week of antibiotic therapy. Pt next scheduled on Thursday, June 20, 2024, for woundcare visit and provider evaluation

Today's care:

1. The home dressings were gently removed.
2. The left lower leg was wrapped with a warm wet towel and chlorhexidine soap applied to the wounds.
3. The sites were wiped with NS moistened gauze.
4. Lidocaine 2% jelly was applied to the open wounds.
5. Each open area was gently debrided using a 4 mm curette.
6. All sites were gently wiped with NS moistened gauze
7. Melgisorb Ag was shaped to fit each wound
8. Carradres hydrogel dressings were cut to fit and applied to each wound
9. 4 inch stretch gauze was wrapped around the LLE and taped to itself with paper tape
10. The sock was put back on. Son had dressed pt with up to thigh pressure stockings
11. Right LE with petroleum gauze placed over the area
12. RLE wrapped with 4 inch stretch gauze and taped to itself with paper tape

Left Leg wounds. Measurements not taken:

1. Left Medial Ankle
2. Left Medial Ankle Anterior Satellite
3. Left Proximal Lateral Ankle and Superior Lateral Foot: irregular and long
4. Wound between 3 & 5
5. Left Distal Lateral Shin and small medial satellite

Right Lower Leg with pictures taken:

1. Multiple small weeping petechia like wounds in a patch at distal tibia

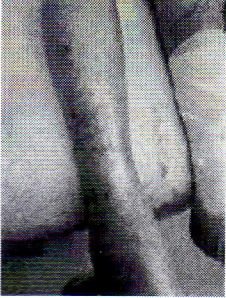
